Scott Titt - brief history

On Christmas day 1968 I climbed my first route, Flying Buttress on Dinas Cromlech. By the 70's I was representing the Swanage CC at BMC meetings in Bristol. I became the Swanage access volunteer in the years that followed; negotiating the access to Skeleton Ridge, and the Swanage bolt agreements being especially memorable.

Notable events in my climbing and mountain career have been involvement in the new route scene at Swanage and Pembroke, a multi-day ascent in Norway, skiing up Snowdon from Llanberis, finding the new crag of Ddaear Ddu on Moel Siabod, and realising the potential of San Vito in Sicily. The development of San Vito has occupied much of my free time in the last 5 years, culminating with the opening of a new 18 pitch route on Monte Monaco http://www.ukclimbing.com/articles/page.php?id=4445

In the new millennium I represented the Wessex MC at SW area meetings and became a National councillor for the BMC. I became President of the Wessex MC for three years and when my term was up I was elected to the BMC Executive, as one of the National Council's representatives.

At the 2010 BMC AGM I was elected as a Vice President, I now face the daunting task of taking over from Rab Carrington after his energetic 3 years as President.
